

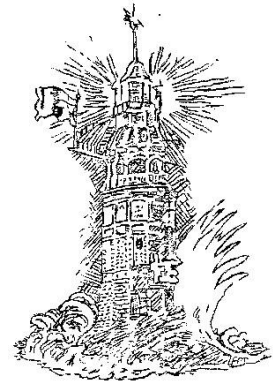

### The Beacon Society Award



As we approach the ending of another school year, you may have engaged students in a Sherlock Holmes related project that qualifies for the Beacon Award or may be planning such a project for the upcoming school year that will be completed before the November 15th deadline. If so, please review the nomination form and submit your materials The Beacon Society - The Beacon Award.

Nominees may be of any profession, but they must have made a significant contribution to exposing young people to the stories of Sherlock Holmes. An applicant may either be nominated by another person or may apply himself/herself. A group or scion society may be nominated. A project(s) must be completed before applying for the Beacon Award.

Beacon Award nominations may be submitted all year. The closing date for evaluation during the current review cycle is November 15, 2018. Once evaluation has been completed the winner will be notified in December 2018. Nominations made after the deadline will be held for evaluation in 2018.

Each year the Beacon Society Award is given to an individual, scion society, or organization that has made a significant contribution to exposing young people to the study of Sherlock Holmes stories.

Each Award consists of a:

- Certificate and a check for \$221
- One-year Serpentine Muse and The Baker Street Journal subscription to the recipient or a school/organization of the recipient's choice.
- Summary of the winner's activity on the Beacon Society website

The Beacon Society is a scion society of The Baker Street Irregulars, an international organization of Sherlock Holmes enthusiasts founded in 1934 by Christopher Morley. The Irregulars (known as the BSI) meet every January in New York City for a weekend of celebration and study.
