Re: Report of Final Sherlock Holmes Program at Innovation Youth

Dear members of the Jan Stauber Grant Program at the Beacon Society,

It is my pleasure to submit a final report of the Sherlock Holmes program at the Innovation Youth children's library. Thanks to the Beacon Society's contribution, we were able to walk alongside our community members as they discovered the literary and cultural significance of Sherlock Holmes. We hope you will find this report informative as you read about our completed project, the goals achieved and how the Beacon Society helped us positively impact the Innovation Youth children's library community.

Description of Completed Project

Upon receiving funding from the Beacon Society, our library team purchase over 20 Sherlock Holmes books in English and French. We purchased a diverse collection (eg: graphic novels in French, children's adaptation of the classics, graphic novels of Enola Holmes, etc) in order to captivate a diverse group of readers. We then created informational posters on Sir Arthur Conan Doyle and the main characters of the Sherlock Holmes stories. This poster featured Enola Holmes in order to provide an example of a strong female hero in contemporary mystery literature.

As many children in our community attend French schools and require support in learning French as a second language, we made a poster with key words from the Sherlock universe in French.

Finally, on October 14, we held our first Sherlock Holmes event at the Innovation

Youth children's library! Not only were there a variety of Sherlock-themed books available to read and discuss but we also created puzzles that children could complete with their parents. One of the books featured in this event contained pages full of mysteries for participants to solve using simple tools. The completed project resulted in a family centered activity where children could discover Sherlock and Enola Holmes in English and French while engaging in lively discussions and activities with their peers.

Goals achieved

After weeks of planning this event, we are pleased to say that the following goals were achieved:

- **Participants will develop a rapport with the library staff and volunteers.** This goal was achieved as the staff members and volunteers present at the event are all experienced workers who regularly interact and build connections with children from this community.
- **Participants will have the opportunity to socialize with peers their age and build friendships.** Not only did the Sherlock Holmes Night feature books but also puzzles and games that children could play together, thus allowing them to bond with one another through play.
- **Participants will have the opportunity to learn the cultural significance of the Sherlock Holmes legacy.** After purchasing the books, we made several social media posts about these new additions to the library. In these ways, children could use an afternoon at the library, or their time on social media platforms, to learn more about the cultural importance of the Sherlock Holmes legacy.
- **Participants will have the opportunity to learn about Sherlock Holmes in French and develop their French reading skills, allowing them to be better integrated into a French-speaking society.** As mentioned above, we bought Sherlock and Enola Holmes books in French. We made sure that these books were for a range of reading levels in order to allow as many children as possible to read these stories in French. Since these books are now available for loan at the children's library,

members have the ongoing opportunity to discover Sherlock Holmes while continually improving their French.

Project's Impact on Innovation Youth & the Children's Library Community

Obtaining this grant impacted our organization in several ways:

The Beacon society's support allowed us to organize an event that we have never done before. The past two years have been a time of great transition as we have experienced the impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic on our own organization and our neighborhood community. Due to these challenges, it was difficult to think of new activities to bring to the library that would interest children while also helping them practice French. This grant allowed our organization to achieve both these objectives.

Obtaining the Jan Stauber grant also helped us diversify our library collection; we are pleased to say that we now have over 25 adaptations of Sherlock Holmes stories in various formats that can interest many readers!

The generous support of the Beacon Society also had a positive impact on children and families in our community:

As mentioned above, this grant provided an opportunity for members to build a rapport with library staff and volunteers. By continually being available to the community through these kinds of events, members develop ongoing trust with us.

With all this being said, we would once again like to thank the members of the Jan Stauber Grant Program at the Beacon Society. Your support not only positively impacted Innovation Youth but also our community. This is why we acknowledged the support of the Jan Stauber Grant Program of the Beacon Society in this program. Your generous assistance has been invaluable and we hope to work with you again in the future.





Did you know?

Conan Doyle was also an enthusiastic investigator. He resolved a few mysteries. Particularly, the one he succeeded to free Oscar Slater out of prison. Oscar Slater was convicted à tort pour le murder of a 82 old woman.

Doyle presented himself as the candidate in the parliament in 1900 and in 1906. He was able to get a good number of votes but never succeeded to win.

He started an ophthalmology clinic in London, but failed. This is what pushed him to writing.


He volunteered as a military doctor on a navy for Africa. This experience inspired him to write one of his story "The captain of the Polestar".
