

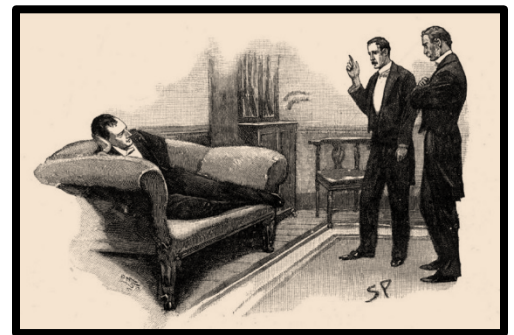


The Memoirs of Sherlock Holmes
