THE GUIDE'S CREATOR, GEORGE BRADSHAW, 1801-1853, WAS AN ENGRAVER AND PUBLISHER IN MANCHESTER AND HAD ALREADY ESTABLISHED HIS REPUTATION WITH HIS PUBLICATION BRADSHAW'S MAPS OF INLAND NAVIGATION.





ALTHOUGH HE CONTRACTED CHOLERA WHILE ON A TRIP TO NORWAY AND DIED BEFORE LEAVING THE COUNTY, HIS GUIDES CONTINUED TO BE PUBLISHED UNTIL 1961...





...WHEN THE NATIONALIZATION OF THE RAILWAYS, THE RISE IN AUTOMOBILES, AND THE CREATION OF A MODERN HIGHWAY SYSTEM ALL LED TO A DECLINE IN RAIL TRAVEL.



IN 2010, A BBC SERIES BY MICHAEL PORTILLO RE-IGNITED INTEREST IN BRADSHAW'S GUIDES.


