THE SUSAN Z. DIAMOND BEACON AWARD

Each year the Susan Z. Diamond Beacon Award is given to an individual, scion society, or organization that has made a significant contribution to exposing young people to the study of Sherlock Holmes stories.

Nominees may be of any profession, but they must have made a significant contribution to exposing young people to the stories of Sherlock Holmes either through a completed single program or a continuing effort. An applicant may either be nominated by another person or may apply himself/herself. A group or scion society may be nominated. An applicant need not be the recipient of a Jan Stauber Grant.

THE 2020 JAN STAUBER GRANTS

Cindy Brown has announced that the Jan Stauber Grant Committee has approved 8 applications (with another pending) for the 2020 Jan Stauber Grant



Program. At the Society's annual meeting in January, the Board of Directors approved the grant allocation from \$600 to \$750. The number of applications increase in 2020 from the 5 applications approved in 2019.

The Board of Directors also approved providing a copy of the Baker Street Irregulars Press 2019 publication Education Never Ends to each JSG applicant that submits their program's final report to the JSG Committee.

We all know some teachers or librarians among our family, friends and in our local communities. We can expand our JSG applications by personally reaching out to them. Run off copies of the application and deliver them in person. School administrations dictate a teacher's curriculum. If you can create an opportunity to meet with an administrator or attend a School Board meeting, you may be able to convince them of the merits of applying for a Grant.



Now in their 4th year of operation, the Junior Sherlockian Society continues to bring youth to Sherlock Holmes.



Thanks to Shannon and her Committee, the JSS continues to be one of the crown jewels of the Beacon Society.



Once the program is ready to launch, all you would have to do is to stop by your local library and ask; "Can we help you setup a display promoting Sherlock Holmes?"


I can't imagine that you would be turned down!

After a slate of candidates has been assembled, a vote by the General Membership will be conducted in August, with the new team taking office on October 1st.
