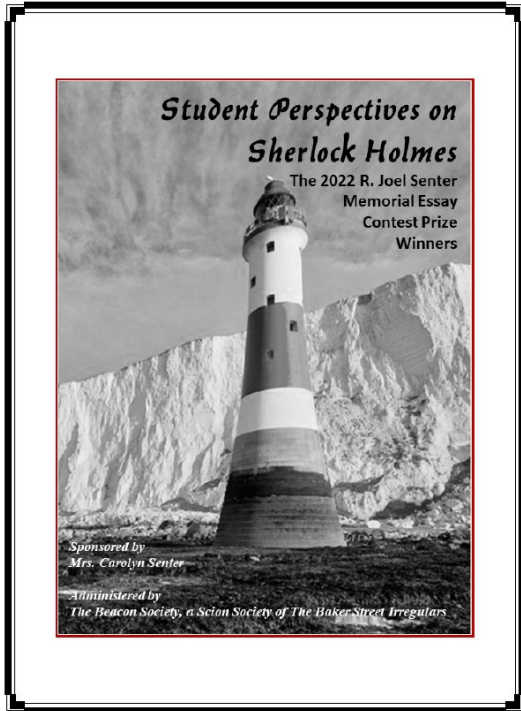

Junior Sherlockian Society

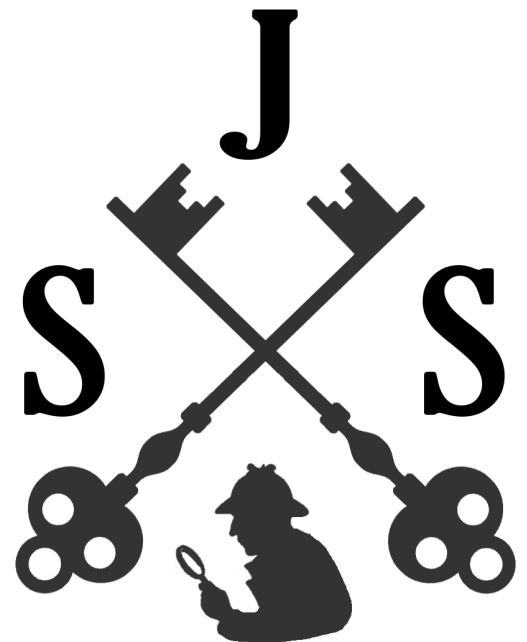


Change is also happening in the Junior Sherlockian Society, where we're saying goodbye to founder and head Shannon Carlisle.

4. When you hover over the Beacon Society name, you can see additional information and track how much you've donated through your purchases.
5. It's that simple... And the Beacon Society will receive a deposit from Amazon each quarter for all the purchases made by Sherlockians under this program.

Grants

Awarding Jan Stauber Grants is one of the most important aspects of the Beacon Society mission. These grants are used to help educators buy Sherlock-related books in a variety of formats, including Braille, to support theatre programs with canonical themes, to create hands-on labs for students to learn deductive skills, among many others.

In order to make the application process more accessible to educators and program-leaders, the Grants Committee decided to accept applications throughout the year and to increase the top limit to the amount that may be requested to \$1,000.
